**Comments concerning proposed rulemakings**

It is my understanding that these rules were established in order to facilitate a critical designation from electricity providers to allow production to continue during intentional rolling blackouts to maintain power supply across the state. However, it appears that nobody has brought up the fact that every single well we operate that is designated as "critical" does not require electricity AT ALL to continue production. We do not need critical designation from an electric provider because we DO NOT HAVE ONE. We should not be required to pay a \$150 fee to avoid wasting my time to file this nonsense. Have the electrical company build their map, then send letters to the operators of the wells included in that map to file their CI-D paperwork. Also, the CID online filing system has an absolute garbage CSV parser (probably because we don't have an electric provider, so it's confused as to why we're filing in the first place).

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
